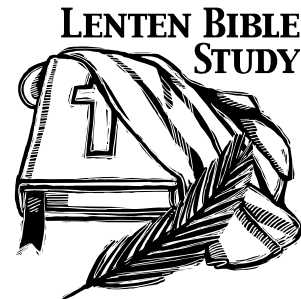
REPORTS FROM COMMITTEES
